9. In classes calling for two or more stems or blooms, the flowers should be as nearly alike in all respects as possible. They should be the same color, size, form, stage of development or maturity, and stem foliage.

10. Cut flowers will be judged with their foliage. There should be no foliage below the water line.

GENERAL RULES AND POLICIES

1. The FFA exhibit will be governed and controlled under the general rules and regulations pertaining to the fair, such as health and sanitation, entries and other which apply in general.

2. Exhibits shown in FFA must be owned by the exhibitors, either in individual or in partnership.

3. Livestock shown can be either registered or high grade stock, but must be of pure breeding. Market classes may be crossbreds.

Entries are open only to those members of FFA in Martin County. A member may show if they have not reached the age of 21 and their dues are paid.

5. An exhibitor may show two entries in one lot (livestock only) but only one first prize will be awarded in each lot. One entry will be allowed in group lots.

6. The entry fee shall be \$2.00 per head for cattle and horses. \$1.00 per head for swine and sheep and \$0.50 for poultry and rabbits. There will be an \$8.00 per head bedding charge for beef cattle if not dual shown in a 4-H class.

7. In case of illness, a member may substitute another member to show his entry with the approval of the department superintendent.

8. Breeding animals for beef, dairy, sheep and swine must be owned by the exhibitor by June 1 of the current fair year.

- 9. Market animals must be owned and fed for at least 60 days.
- 10. The judge shall decide the merit of each entry and make all awards.
- 11. All FFA entries should be given to your FFA advisor by August 5th.

12. FFA horse exhibitors are not required but encouraged to wear a helmet. A minimum of a short sleeve shirt, jeans, western hat or helmet and boots are required.



b) Educational value.....25%

c) Knowledge and ability to explain.....50%

- Value of good time management skills to meet their goals and responsibilities
- Importance of managing their own financial resources and making business decisions
- The value of teamwork, good sportsmanship, and competition

WHO IS IN THE 4-H AUCTION?

4-Her's who have earned a specific ribbon award are allowed to participate in the 4-H Auction:

- General Exhibitors (e.g. Crafts and Fine Arts, Robotics, Quilting, Photography, and etc.) who receive either a Grand Champion or Reserve Champion Ribbon
 - Elivestock Exhibitors who receive a Grand Champion, Reserve Champion, Purple or Blue Ribbon.

Seventy percent (70%) of the premium will go to the individual youth to re-invest in future 4-H projects and thirty percent (30%) will be deducted from each auction entry for the continuation of the 4-H Federation to promote educational activities for all 4-H'ers in Martin County.

This is your opportunity to help these young people celebrate their success and encourage them, and others, to even greater heights of achievement.
